GRANT PURPOSE

This grant opportunity is available to assist those who are providing emergency child care during the COVID-19 response. This is a non-competitive grant program funded by the federal CARES Act.





- This is the second phase of the Emergency Child Care grant program.
- Licensed and licensed exempt providers are eligible to apply.
- Sites that received approval for grant funding under Phase 1 are not eligible for Phase 2.



AM I ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

For Certified Center, Certified Family, and Registered Family Licensed Providers:

- Submit an application to be an Emergency Child Care provider by June 30, 2020, and
- Commit to adhering to health and safety guidelines, and
- If currently open, agree to remain open and serve children through the end of September 2020. If currently closed, agree to reopen by September 1, 2020 and remain open and serve children through the end of September 2020.



AM I ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

For Licensed Exempt Providers

- Is a Family, Friend & Neighbor provider (Regulated Subsidy or Relative Care) receiving child care payments through the Department of Human Services, and
- Is currently open and caring for a child of an essential worker, and
- Agrees to remain open and serve children through the end of September 2020.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- Allowable use of funds: lease/mortgage, utilities, insurance, food and supplies, staff compensation and benefits and other reasonable operating costs.
- If currently open, agree to remain open and serve children through the end of September 2020.
- If currently closed, agree to reopen by September 1, 2020 and remain open and serve children through the end of September 2020.
- Submit follow up report to confirm open status.
- Maintain financial and attendance records for six years.
- Register for a DUNS Number required to recieveve federal funds







Grant agreement with DUNS Number and W-9 form must be returned in order to receive payment.

All Emergency Child Care Grantees will need a DUNS number. The information in this guide explains how to register for a DUNS number.

Why do I need a DUNS Number?

You must have DUNS number in order to receive federal CARES Act funds. You will be required to enter your DUNS number when signing your grant agreement. The grant agreement cannot be executed without your DUNS number. You must apply for a DUNS number for each physical location for which you operate child care.

What is a DUNS Number?

The Data Universal Numbering System—or DUNS number—is a unique nine-digit identifier for a business created by Dun & Bradstreet. DUNS numbers have become the standard numbering system required by the federal government track how federal money is allocated to businesses. The DUNS number is **NOT** your TAX Identification Number (TIN), Employer Identification Number (EIN) or Social Security Number (SSN).

How long does it take to obtain a DUNS number?

Allow up to three business days to obtain a DUNS number.

How much does it cost?

Registering for a DUNS number **is free of charge.** If you encounter any organizations or websites soliciting a fee or charge to acquire a DUNS number please do not proceed, as you may acquire a DUNS for free directly from Dun & Bradstreet.
